



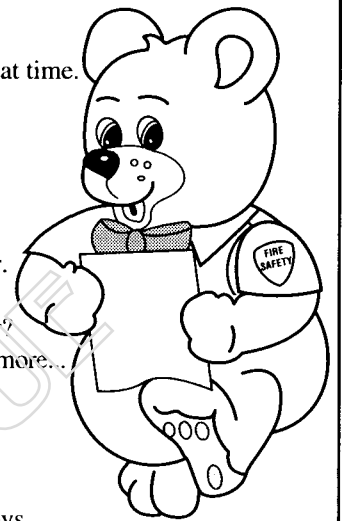
Teddie writes a poem...
